
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Fun Facts Tom James

Old school big-block Corvette fans received a brief thrill in 1990 when the 454-powered ZR2 roadster concept car appeared on the covers of magazines such as Vette, Corvette World, and others. Backed by a ZF 6-speed manual transmission and tuned to produce 360 hp, it looked completely stock and ready for the showroom floor. At the time, the 488-ci, 400-hp, V10-equipped Dodge Viper was slowly transforming from a show car into reality, so General Motors assigned Scott Allman and Scott Leon to assemble a potential response. Best of all, 1990 would have marked the 25th anniversary of the 1965 396 Sting Ray option, so why not? Federal emissions and fuel-economy restrictions, that's why not. Despite the use of a prototype Tuned Port EFI induction system and the fact that the 454 easily fit the C4 chassis, the tire-melting 454 ZR2 never made It to dealer showrooms. Oh, what might have been!

Another major factor that likely killed the return of the 454 was the fact that General Motors had invested millions of dollars in another super-Vette, the 1990 ZR1. Its all-aluminum, 32-valve, DOHC, 5.7-liter V-8 was a joint effort between Lotus and General Motors and was poised to become "King of the Hill' (a term General Motors hated but the automotive press loved). With an option price of more than \$27,000 beyond the base Corvette's \$30,000 plus sticker, the ZR1 did not need any competition from within. And, frankly, a mild 454 might have embarrassed the ZR1's LT5 DOHC mill at a fraction of the price. So there was that, too. The ZR2 454 Corvette Roadster, affectionally nicknamed "Big Doggie" sold for \$65,000 at the 2009 Barrett-Jackson West Palm Beach collector car auction.

Tom James chairman opened the meeting by thanking everyone who came and volunteered to work during the swap meet this past weekend at Kelsey Chevrolet. We had 250 people come through the doors. Everybody has reasons for why we were so low in attendance. It was St. Patrick's Day, basketball tournament, and we had no sign. Tom suggested we rent a sign for future meets, etc. The Shriner's did not show up, not sure why? Terrie James will contact them.

We only sold \$300 in raffle tickets Sunday at the event which is way down from previous years. Tom said the vending people did alright that he talked to. Some people did have their items priced a little high.

We did have a good turnout of volunteers all day long; can't thank them enough. George had the idea of a banner sign, and Tom proposed a lighted sign. Tom thinks we may be able to get 5 to 10 people a day with it. Steve Barrett made the suggestion of selling tickets without a date starting sometime in the near future so they can be sold year-round. This way we can sell more tickets. Terrie will revise the tickets to reflect this change and submit for printing in the near future.

One swap meet attendee asked Tom how many club members won and if it is a fair system. Tom replied we have a third party draw the ticket, and they were shuffled several times plus the third party had his back to the wheel when drawing the winners. Two tickets were pulled from the left side of the cage, and one to the right. The owner of dealership, Mike Kelsey, was the person who did the drawing of the tickets.

Steve Barrett brought up that people were leaving at 11AM but was reminded that we had no new traffic come in the door after 11:30AM. We cannot force vendors to stay. We did not sell out the swap spaces, so maybe we need to advertise more.

Tom brought up the point that we are down to 78 members, from a high of over 100. It has been suggested that it is because of what is going on at the national level.

Tom asked George Denman to be our ambassador at these types of events. George suggested handing out flyers regarding our Chapter and the National at his car show. He could pass out about 200 flyers at his show. Tom James requested that George create a Chapter flyer to be distributed. Terrie gave George the current flyer as an example to be used.

Tom James then thanked Tom Keen for his sponsorship of the club; there was a big round of applause. Tom Keen has come up with a new remote mirror system for the 76-82 corvette and Chevelle. It is a very quality part and works very well. Tom Keen said GM gets 15% of any part that is licensed.

George asked us to sponsor his car show, and it was suggested that we show up with 15 cars to his event. A motion was suggested and passed to commit to 15 Corvettes to his event which will be held on June 1, 2024, at St. Susanna.

Terrie James, Membership Chairperson, went over the membership information Tom shared with us. We currently have 78 members and one potential new in attendance at tonight's meeting. Terrie sends reminders out every month and makes sure every potential new member receives a packet of material. We must be careful about handing out NCRS stickers and information because someone could put that sticker on their car and say they are a member or had it judged.

Barb Hilbert, Treasurer, went over the finances for the month and a motion was passed and accepted. We will be donating roughly \$2500 to the Shriners Children's Hospital of Ohio.

Tom James reminded everyone to send George pictures in PDF format or JPEG of your vehicles to be posted on our website.

Technical Article

1963-1982 Corvette AC Hose Replacement

Corvette engine compartments are inhospitable for rubber. The high temperatures, oil and gas vapors and infrared heat from exhaust manifolds are tough on AC hoses. Fortunately these hoses often are easy to change. Zip Corvette offers many AC hoses as complete assemblies and at a reasonable price. Follow along to see what is involved with changing those hoses, along with some helpful tips.

After replacing an AC hose, the system should be held at a high vacuum to remove any water or moisture that may have entered. A vacuum pump and gauge set can be borrowed from several auto parts chain stores. If you don't want to vacuum the system and install the refrigerant, just take the car to an AC repair shop. You still can be happy in the knowledge that you saved labor costs for the hose replacement and had the right part installed the way you want.



01: A new <u>AC Condenser Liquid Line for a 1973 Corvette</u> arrived quickly from <u>Zip Corvette</u>. Replacement hoses should have the proper size rubber O-rings on the fittings and plastic caps to keep dust and debris from getting inside the hoses. These are made in the USA.



02: Consider getting a new AC V-belt, like this <u>1973 350ci Air Condition Belt</u>. Zip Corvette has these available with the original imprinting on the outside with GM part number, size, manufacture's logo and codes. You can specify the desired quarter of manufacture and they are made in the USA.



03: A 1973-1977E VIR Maintenance Kit is also advisable if the system has a replaceable desiccant bag. Replacing the VIRs of 1973 to 1977 early-build Corvettes is fairly easy. Note: the desiccant packaging should not be opened until ready to install and the system is ready to vacuum. Other AC systems may have a Drier/Receiver like AC Drier/Receiver for 1968-72 Corvettes. All are made in the USA.



04: Check to make sure that the fittings and pipe bends on the replacement hose are identical to the old hose. A number of different AC hoses were used over the years on Corvettes. This hose is for 1973 only.



05: The shiny oily area on the flap is a telltale to the AC leak. If oil is seen on the hood over the front of the compressor, its front seal is leaking. In this case, the oil leak came from the installation of an aftermarket sight glass. Tip: most replacement hoses now have a hard plastic barrier lining which doesn't seal well on metal nipples when used with standard hose clamps.



06: Oil should be added to the AC System if a considerable amount has leaked out. Be aware that there are a number of different oils used in auto AC Systems and not all are compatible. This system still had R12 Freon and used mineral oil.



07: Install the more difficult hose end first. In this case, it was the connection to the VIR assembly. This was best accessed from below. Use one hand to rotate and move the free end to help align the other end. Tip: heating the new hose can make it more flexible and easier to bend.



08: Make sure to hold the evaporator or condenser fitting to prevent rotating its metal tube when disconnecting these hoses. If the fitting turns, its joint may break at the condenser or evaporator, causing more work and expense.



09: When both ends of the hose are connected, and the hose is routed the proper way, tighten the fittings. They don't have to be very tight, because the O-rings do the sealing. Applying a little AC oil or antiseize compound on the threads will make any future disassembly easier.



10: Connect the high and low pressure hoses of the gauge set if you are vacuuming the system. On this system, the low side hose connects to the VIR. That location is very tight, and may require modifying a right angle adapter.



11: The gauge set's high side hose connects to the hose block on the rear of this compressor. Tip: after the system is charged, disconnect the gauge hoses when their respective pressures are at minimum. For the high side, that means when the engine is off and for the low side, when the AC is on.



12: A vacuum pump was available as a loan from the local auto parts store. You pay for it up front and then they reimburse you when you return it. The center (yellow) hose on the gauge set connects to the vacuum pump.



13: The vacuum pump soon attained a vacuum over 29"HG. This level of vacuum held for over an hour after the pump was shut off, indicating no leaks are likely. The high vacuum is used to boil and remove any water or moisture from the system.




14: After installing just over 3 pounds of R12, the pressures were right on target at 29.5 and 250 psi. Tip: placing the refrigerant cans in hot water increases the pressure inside the can to speed delivery into the system. Job completed – now it's time to be cool again.
