

Fun Facts Tom James

Detroit had a long tradition of applying exciting military names to road-going vehicles including the Ford Mustang, Buick Wildcat, Dodge Hellcat, and many others, so when GM ad man Myron C. Scott suggested the Corvette nameplate public awareness of the name was strong. Less than a decade earlier, corvette-class warships made worldwide headlines stalking enemy submarines and surface vessels. Tapping into this gung-ho reputation was a natural move calculated to attract young, male customers, many of whom either likely served on corvette-class vessels not long before or knew someone who did. Today, nobody remembers the oceangoing version; the tail that wags the dog.

Modern restorers of 1953 Corvettes seeking highquality photographs of obscure details and unseen nooks and crannies owe a huge debt of gratitude to....Chrysler Corporation. The engineering division of Chrysler's Technical Information Section acquired Corvette number E53F001076 (the 76h car from the 300-car run) and performed a deep-dive phytophagic investigation of its many unique details. Dated March 1954, Chryslers' report contained 50 high quality photos depicting overall views, panel fit irregularities, VIN locations, trunk-compartment hinge design, layout, convertible-top mechanism, and more. No doubt Chrysler was curious about Corvette's novel fiberglass body construction.

January QCNCRS Meeting Minutes ...Kenn Bragg

Kelsey Chevrolet Greendale, Indiana

Tom James, President, called the meeting to order and thanked everyone for attending in the freezing conditions. He also thanked Kelsey Chevrolet for hosting the meeting.

Tom stated that the current Queen City Chapter membership count was at 80; the number is up only a by a few. We need to increase our membership. Our current goal is at 100. He stated that we were trending with the National average. The current National number is just under 11K and is trending down 20%, similar to our numbers.

John Waggoner brought up the topic that the National has retained a marketing company working to help with membership. Several of our members suggested working with the National Corvette Museum to help increase our membership. They have a large annual draw of patrons interested in Corvettes from all over the country.

Tom James again took the floor and stated that the National Judging Event is in Las Vegas this year. The National is asking for \$300 from each chapter to offset the cost of judges. He then asked for a count and a motion to donate \$300. This motion was unanimously turned down by a vote of 22 against and 0 for. The membership discussed getting more sponsors to contribute to the National Convention.

Steve Barrett suggested we work on attracting more C5 to C8 owners to our club. Several members made suggestions to attract the owners of these model years. We, as a Corvette club, need to possibly work with dealers to disseminate information to new and younger Corvette owners.

Skip Polowy asked about the National Board meetings. He wanted to know if they are opened to all members to attend. We were not sure of the answer. It will be researched, and we will have an answer at the next meeting.


January QCNCRS Meeting Minutes ...Kenn Bragg (continued...)

Tom James then moved on to the annual swap meet to benefit the Shriner's Hospital for Children. The date is Sunday, March 16, 2025, from 8:00am to 2:00PM. It will be held at Kelsey Chevrolet in Greendale, Indiana again this year. Kelsey is our Chapter sponsor and generously donated their facility for our indoor event. With only about two months left, we need to really push raffle ticket sales to achieve our goal of \$4K. We are still in need of a few more vendors to maximize our booth rentals.

Terrie James, Membership Chairperson, reiterated the need to sell raffle tickets for the swap meet. Terrie asked for volunteers for Split the Pot during the event. We as a club need to solicit companies for donations for the silent raffle baskets. She asked for a volunteer to take over this spot in 2026 and Skip Polowy has agreed. Terrie thanked the members that are donating the meat, buns and donuts to sell at the meet. The Shriner's will bring the Fez hat to put by the road the day of the event. Our event is adverted in the Show and Shine Calendar, on Facebook and on our Chapter website. The event will be broadcast on Eagle 99.3, all Cumulus stations and WDJO. Terrie also reported that 11 members still need to pay their 2025 annual Chapter dues. Terrie will send out notices to members to help keep them in good standing.

Barb Hilbert, Treasurer, gave the treasure report. She itemized club expenses and receivables. A motion was made to accept the report and was passed 22 for and 0 against.

Tom James asked if there was any new business or questions. There was none. Split-the-pot was drawn and the meeting was closed.








