On Friday, June 20th we will be having a road tour culminating at one of the summer grill outs hosted by the Shriners of Southeastern Indiana lodge in Dillsboro, Indiana. The Shriners hold grill outs one time per month, beginning in May and running through September. These dinners help to raise money for the Shriners Hospital for Children. The Southeastern Indiana Chapter of the Shriners has helped us out the day of our swap meets selling raffle tickets and splitthe-pot tickets at our event. The road tour will leave the Kroger parking lot on the south side of the lot (nearest the pharmacy drive through), 4001 Hamilton Cleves Road, Cleves, Ohio 45002, and travel the 25-mile distance, 1/2 hour, down US 50 to their location in Dillsboro, Indiana. The last time the club did this we had a great meal and about 15 cars on the road tour. 



Fun Facts Tom James

What did the Corvair, the C4 Corvette, and the 1977 Porsche 928 have in common? Well, if it weren't for the Corvair, the 928 wouldn't have happened, and if it weren't for the 928, the C4 probably would have been a mid-engine configuration and perhaps would have killed the Corvette brand before long. From about 1968 to 1972, Porsche, maker of rear and mid-engine sports cars since its beginning, watched in fear as the rear-engine Corvair was raked over the coals of the legal system by critics and safety zealots. As early as 1973, Porsche management and designers (Ernst Fuhrman, Helmut Flegl, Tony Lapine and others) rightly feared the US government might ban rear-engine cars outright. Because the US was Porsche's primary export market, the company's future was at stake. To avert a potential crisis, the more conventional front-engine, V-8 1977 928 and its 1976 924 predecessor were released. This forced General Motors to reconsider the fate of the front-engine Corvette and embrace it, once again, for the C4. Let's not forget, Corvette chief engineer Dave McLellan was an avid Porsche owner before taking over for Arkus-Duntov, who also held Porsche in high regard and was a factory-sponsored driver.

There were many financial reasons that provided better care for the children. The Shriners focus on treatments for burn victims. Donations from organizations like ours offset the cost of treatment. The average cost is \$200k per child. Tom James, Chairman, then presented Bethany with matching funds check in the amount of \$500.00 to the Shiners.

Jamie Schworer, Treasurer, read the financial report line by line. She also said that we are now able to accept payments by Zelle if anyone wants to pay with it. A motion was made to accept the report; it was seconded, and the motion was accepted unanimously.

Terrie James, Membership Chairperson, stated that we had a new member sign up that afternoon. The new member introduced himself. His name is Armour "Mac" Pugh. Terrie then spoke about our cruise event on June 20th to the Shriners of Southeastern Indiana lodge. We will meet at the Kroger on State Rte 128 and Rt. 50.
