#### Fun Facts ..... Tom James

Body-color painted headlamp trim rings easily identify early 1956 Corvettes. Intended to stretch the appearance of the front fenders, the applied paint was highly prone to chipping. Within a month of startup, General Motors reverted to the bright, chrome-plated rings used through the 1957 model run.

In January 1957, a vented gas tank was added to the Corvette to prevent vapor slosh and surge on hot days. To accommodate the rubber-fume-exhaust tube, a small exit hole and rubber grommet were added next to the fuel filler and gas cap. It was all positioned beneath the hinged fuel flap adjacent to the driver-side door. As was the case in 1953-1955, the 1956-1962 fuel flap door was made of metal, not fiberglass.

In 1957, Corvettes painted Inca Silver previewed a new paint formulation that all GM divisions would adopt beginning in 1958. To support the metallic content of Inca Silver (and the growing overall trend toward metallic paint), nitrocellulose lacquer replaced GM's age-old nitrocellulose paint. The rest of the 1957 Corvette color palette relied on nitrocellulose for that final year. Only 65 of the 6,339 Corvettes built in 1957 wore Inca Silver paint. Enamel paint was used universally on virtually all GM wheels (Corvette included) because of its durable nature.

The NCRS is celebrating the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the forming of the national club. The folks attending the National Convention in Hampton Roads, VA will be treated to a series of special events. The latest Driveline documented some key events and facts about our 50-year history, including information about the beginning of serval chapters. Even though many of the key founding members of the NCRS were from the Cincinnati area, Cincinnati did not have a formal chapter until 1994. To focus in on the beginnings of our chapter, I asked Joe Eyl, our historian to go to the way-back machine and see if he could locate any of our original documents or newsletters from the beginning. He was able to locate the 2<sup>nd</sup> draft of our club's Bylaws that were approved on April 19, 1994. Here is a copy of that document:

## 2nd Draft Reviewed at 4-19-94 meeting and approved for submitting BYLAWS FOR THE QUEEN CITY CHAPTER OF THE NCRS, INC.

#### INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this document is to provide the Queen City Chapter of the National Corvette Restorers Society, Inc. members with a uniform set of guidelines by which to operate and embodies the requirements as set forth by the NCRS in the NCRS Chapter Manual.

These guidelines offer a reasonable level of operational flexibility and must be closely observed in order to preserve the purpose and standards of the NCRS Inc. Failure to observe the chapter guidelines can result in revocation of the Queen City Chapter charter by the NCRS.

#### ARTICLE I PURPOSE

NCRS Inc. sanctions chapters to promote NCRS activities on a regional or local scale.

The Queen City Chapter exists to provide a local outlet for NCRS activities and allows membership an opportunity to participate in local events.

The Queen City Chapter will not be in competition with the national level activities but rather serve as a medium for a further expression of NCRS philosophy, which is the restoration, preservation, and history of the Chevrolet Corvette.

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

1.0 Membership of the Queen City Chapter shall be open to any NCRS members in good standing and who submits a Queen City Chapter membership application accompanied by dues as prescribed by paragraph 5.2 and Article IX.

2.0 There shall be no discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, gender, religion, or national origin.

3.0 Eligibility for membership shall not be restricted to owners of Corvette automobiles.

4.0 Membership in the Queen City Chapter is not transferable or assignable to anyone except the remainder of a paid membership to the surviving spouse in the event of the death of a paid member.

5.0 The Chapter Board of Directors, acting in behalf of the Chapter Membership may from time to time adjust the amount of annual dues as set forth in Article IX.

5.1 The annual dues will cover a twelve month period beginning January 1st of each year.

5.2 New members applying after July 1st will be required to submit only 1/2 of the annual dues amount.

#### 5.3 Membership dues shall be payable on or 30 days prior to the January meeting.

6.0 When membership information is properly entered on the application form and accompanied by one year dues in advance, the member is admitted and issued a Chapter number by the Membership Chairman.

7.0 The name, address, date, and number shall be entered on the records of the Chapter.

8.0 The member is then entitled to any and all services, publications, and benefits provided by the Queen City Chapter for the period covered by dues.

8.1 Should a publication date be delayed beyond a member's paid period, that publication will be forwarded as if it had been published punctually.

9.0 Supervision and/or expulsion shall be set forth as follows:

9.1 When any member shall be in default in the payment of dues, their membership shall automatically be terminated.

9.2 A member who resigns is not entitled to a refund of dues.

10.0 The classes for Membership for the Queen City Chapter are set forth as follows:

10.1 Active members are those who have paid current dues. They are entitled to receive any Chapter publication, including notices of Chapter activities, and shall have the right to one vote for each officer of the Board of Directors of the Queen City Chapter.

10.2 Any active member in the Queen City Chapter shall be eligible to serve in any of the Chapter positions.

10.3 Associate members are the spouse and minor children (under 18 years of age) of an active member.

10.4 Associate members may participate in Chapter functions along with active members without additional dues, but shall have no voting privileges and receive no additional copies of publications.

10.5 Associate members may become active members by application and by paying regular membership dues.

10.6 Honorary members are persons so designated as Honorary members of the NCRS National organization. Honorary members of the NCRS are automatically Honorary members of the Queen City Chapter.

#### **Glass Restoration**

.....from the North Central Chapter If your windshield has light scratches from wiper blades or your side windows are covered with water spots, forget glass cleaner or toothpaste. Professional glass shops use a product called cerium oxide to do the job. It's available from most glass suppliers. It comes in a powder form that must be applied with a damp rag. Even with a buffer it will take quite a while to totally remove a small scratch because glass is extremely hard. Water spots and ground-in grime will clean up quickly.

#### **Paint Prep**

.....from the Northwest Chapter If you are getting ready to do a little paint work on the old Vette (the one you have been spraying *Amorall*<sup>®</sup> on the last few years) — When you have it ready for paint or primer, spray it good with white vinegar, and wipe it down with a new paper towel (no grease rags). It's the best silicone killer money can buy. *-John Panike*

General Motors Customer Service Line has a "Restoration Package" available *free* by calling their toll free number at 1-800-222-1020. The package includes a set of fact sheets about your model year Corvette, a hobby parts catalog, and a nationwide roster of Corvette clubs. GM even pays for the postage. Way to go GM!

#### **Radiator Repair**

.....from the North Central Chapter GM has an ALUMINUM radiator repair kit for repairing core leaks on the newer aluminum radiators. Although he hasn't tried the kit, it appears as though it would certainly be applicable to our early Corvette radiators. The kit uses hot melt adhesive sticks and comes with everything except the torch or heat gun to do the repair. The adhesive flows at about 500 degrees F, so an electric heat gun can be used. The part number for this kit is 1052617 and sells for \$9.95 at your nearest Chevy store. The repair kit has been tried and works! The only drawback is that the kits must be ordered in advance since most dealers don't stock them. -Paul Anderson

#### **Aluminum Fittings**

.....from the North Central Chapter When aluminum fittings are screwed into aluminum housings, the threads will many times seize. This can be avoided by first spraying the threads with a silicone lubricant.
